# **Minutes**

The Board of Directors of the Clarinda Community School District met in regular session on Monday, April 28, 2014, 5:00 p.m., at the Board Room located in the McKinley Building, 423 East Nodaway St., Clarinda, IA 51632.

#### Call to Order

President Fine called the regular meeting to order at 5:00 p.m.

### **Roll Call**

The following board members were present: President Fine, Vice President Sunderman, McComb, and Watkins. Turner was absent.

# Approval of Agenda

A motion was made by Watkins, seconded by McComb, to approve the agenda. Motion carried 4-0.

## **Audience to Visitors**

President Fine welcomed all visitors to the meeting. No visitors chose to address the board at this time.

## **Administrative Reports**

Miss Nook, High School Principal, reported:

- 1. A group of FFA students are in Ames for the State Leadership Conference.
- 2. The high school art show is this evening from 6:30-7:30 p.m. The spring concert for the vocal and instrumental music departments begins at 7:30.
- 3. Prom is this Saturday evening.

Mr. McNeal, Middle School Principal, reported:

- 1. Middle school track students are performing well this spring. We have large numbers in both the boys and girls teams.
- 2. The 8<sup>th</sup> grade band traveled to Kansas City last Saturday, where they received 3<sup>rd</sup> place for their performance at Worlds of Fun.
- 3. Sixth grade students will experience Marsville on Friday.

# Ms. Opperman, Elementary Principal, reported:

## Superintendent Honnold reported:

## **Literacy Curriculum Presentation**

# **Approve Literacy Curriculum Textbooks**

Miss Nook began the presentation explaining that a group of K-12 teachers have been studying last year's Iowa Assessment scores and current year assessments created by the team. The Literacy Team based their textbook selection on the elimination of deficiencies and gaps in current curriculum. The proposed textbook for grades 7-12 is Common Core Literature from Pearson. State Education Reform says that beginning May 1, 2017, 100% of our 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students will be required to score in the proficient range of reading comprehension on the Iowa assessments. Our current Kindergarten will be that 3<sup>rd</sup> grade class. Mrs. Opperman described how the Literacy Team discussed the strengths and weaknesses of the current reading materials from McGraw-Hill, called Treasures. Teachers feel the Treasures book provides strong instruction, but analysis of assessment scores show the need for additional materials in phonics, writing skills, and reading for meaning. The Literacy Team proposes the purchase of additional materials from Developmental Studies Center to address those weaknesses. Following the presentation of materials, a motion was made by Watkins, seconded by Sunderman, to approve the Literacy curriculum textbooks and support materials as presented. Motion carried 4-0.

# Approve Resignation(s)

A motion was made by McComb, seconded by Sunderman, to approve the resignation from Vicki Fulk as elementary teacher effective the end of the current school year. Mrs. Fulk has served Clarinda School students for 36 years. Board members stated their appreciation for the leadership she's shown in elementary buildings throughout the years. Motion carried 4-0.

A motion was made by Sunderman, seconded by Watkins, to approve the resignation from Curt Dow as middle school head wrestling coach for the 2014-2015 season. Curt has been the head coach for the 7-8 wrestling team for over 10 years, served as assistance high school coach under Mike Moreno, and has helped with the little kids wrestling program for many years. Motion carried 4-0.

A motion was made by Watkins, seconded by McComb, to approve the resignation from Rose Johanns as high school secretary, effective the end of the current school year. Motion carried 4-0.

A motion was made by McComb, seconded by Sunderman, to approve the resignation from Angie Degase as food service secretary, effective the end of the current school year. Motion carried 4-0.

# **Approve Contract(s)**

A motion was made by Sunderman, seconded by Watkins, to approve the contract with Ron Grebert to serve as head high school girls' basketball coach for the 2014-2015 season. Mr. Grebert has served as the assistant coach for the last 10 years and currently serves as the girls' golf coach. Motion carried 4-0.

## **Approve Classified and Administrative Contracts for 2014-2015**

A motion was made by Watkins, seconded by McComb, to approve the 2.38% average total package raise for administrators and supervisors for the 2014-2015 school year. Motion carried 4-0.

A motion was made by Sunderman, seconded by McComb, to approve the 3.4% average total package raise for classified staff for the 2014-2015 school year. Motion carried 4-0.
